A Project for the Future: The Modernization of the Ariete

The [Ariete C2 is the first of 90 vehicles](#) that will be upgraded to strengthen the Army's armored capabilities. This project is part of a broad program to renew the heavy vehicle lines, initiated in recent years, and includes not only the modernization of the vehicles but also the acquisition of a decade-long logistical support to ensure long-term operational efficiency.

Corps General **Carmine Masiello**, Chief of Staff of the Army, emphasized the importance of this ceremony as a fundamental step in the continuous evolution of the Armed Force's capabilities. He stated:

“The delivery of the Ariete C2 is not just a technical milestone but a symbol of innovation and close collaboration between the Army and the Defense industry. Deterrence is the foundation of our security, and the Army, thanks to projects like this, is increasingly ready to face future challenges.”
