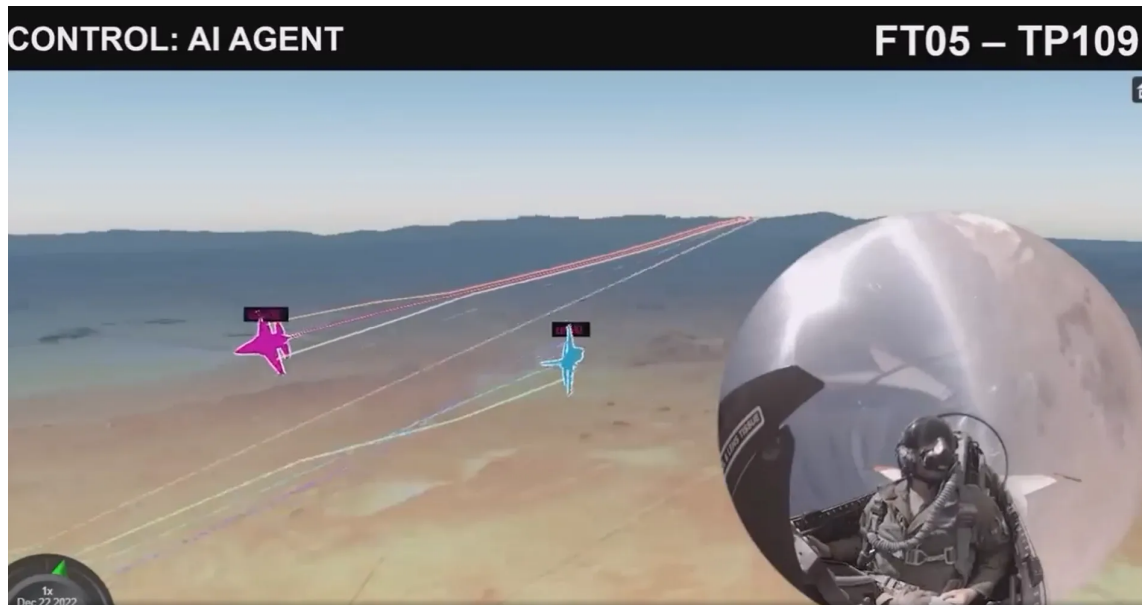




# Artificial Intelligence: The New Frontier of the US Air Force with the Center of Excellence

On May 7, 2025, during [the AFCEA International TechNet Cyber conference](#) (Armed Forces Communications and Electronics Association), the US Air Force announced the creation of a new **Center of Excellence for Artificial Intelligence (AI)**, an ambitious initiative aimed at enhancing the technological capabilities of the US Air Force through strengthened collaborations with prestigious institutions like **MIT, Stanford University, and Microsoft**. This center represents a crucial step in the modernization and innovation journey of the US Air Force, aiming to develop and apply artificial intelligence solutions to improve military operations and national security.

## A New Center for Artificial Intelligence

The new **AI Center of Excellence** will be managed by the **Chief Data and AI Officer of the US Air Force, Susan Davenport**, and will aim to coordinate the development and implementation of advanced technologies in the field of artificial intelligence. In a speech during the conference, the outgoing **Chief Information Officer, Venice Goodwine**, emphasized how the center will leverage existing technological infrastructures, such as those of **Microsoft** and collaborations with **MIT** and **Stanford**, to accelerate the integration of AI into military operations. “AI has a broad continuum of applications,” Goodwine explained, “from productivity to the creation of autonomous systems based on artificial intelligence. Our goal is to ensure that the technologies we develop align with the strategic objectives of the Air Force.”

## Strategic Collaborations for Innovation

The existing collaborations with **MIT** and **Stanford University** play a fundamental role in the success of this initiative. **MIT**, for example, hosts the [AI accelerator](#) of the US Air Force, while the [DAF-Stanford AI Studio](#) is a research center focused on artificial intelligence and emerging technologies, including those used for the design of autonomous aircraft and satellites. A recent project saw the realization of a ten-day intensive course at the **Air Force Test Pilot School** in Edwards, California, involving students in the experimentation of advanced AI technologies, preparing personnel for the adoption of autonomous aerial vehicles.

These collaborations with leading research centers are essential to keep the US Air Force at the forefront in the field of artificial intelligence, an area of growing importance in all sectors, from defense to data analysis, from operations management to airspace protection.

## Extreme Teaming: A New Approach to Collaboration

Another crucial point raised by **Goodwine** concerns the adoption of an approach that the US Air Force defines as “**extreme teaming**”. This concept is based on the need for synergistic cooperation among the different branches of the Department of Defense (DoD), avoiding separate solutions for each service (Army, US Air Force, Space Force, Navy, etc.). “When the

industry approaches the Department of Defense, it must think in integrated, not separate, terms,” Goodwine stated, urging industry partners to present solutions that can be applied across all operational sectors. The goal is to maximize efficiency and optimize resource use through a unique and integrated vision of technologies.

With the “extreme teaming” approach, contracts and investments must be strategic and targeted, avoiding duplications and overlaps. “We cannot afford to have separate agreements for each branch of the armed forces,” Goodwine explained. The key to success lies in concentrating efforts to achieve the maximum impact from each investment, leveraging existing resources before making new financial commitments. In other words, “if you want me to do something new, you must help us with the investments already in place.”

Parallel to the US Air Force initiative, collaborations between the military and academic worlds are also taking shape in Italy. The **Centro Alti Studi per la Difesa (CASD)** and the

**Politecnico di Milano** have recently signed a three-year agreement to collaborate on training, research, and technological innovation projects, particularly in the field of artificial intelligence and digital technologies. This agreement, which also includes the project “**educational digital hub edvance**”, aims to develop advanced training in **digital literacy, AI, and sustainability**. The collaboration between CASD and Politecnico di Milano is another example of how technological innovation can be a bridge between the defense and academic worlds, with the goal of developing cutting-edge solutions for the future of security and defense.
