



Corporal Sara Curtis: The Army Swimmer

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General of the Army Corps Carmine Masiello proudly welcomed the athletes of the Army Sports Group, who distinguished themselves at the recent Italian Absolute Swimming Championships in Riccione. On this occasion, it was Corporal VFP4 Sara Curtis who stole the show, achieving two extraordinary Italian records and earning the respect of everyone in the swimming world.

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A Meeting of Pride and Recognition

the new Italian record in the 100 meters freestyle, surpassing the record held for years by champion Federica Pellegrini.

Sara Curtis: A Prodigious Swimmer

Sara Curtis, a very young talent from Piedmont, drew attention during the Italian Absolute Swimming Championships in Riccione. In an event that saw the participation of the best Italian athletes, the 18-year-old demonstrated extraordinary technical skills, setting new Italian records in various disciplines.

The highlight of her performance came with the victory in the 100 meters freestyle, where she recorded a time that broke the previous record held by Federica Pellegrini since 2016. This achievement was the result of years of hard training and sacrifices, as Curtis herself recounted, expressing her satisfaction in an interview with Rai Sport, stating: "Water is my element. Records are the result of work and sacrifices."

Not only in the 100 meters, but also in the 50 meters freestyle, Sara achieved great success. After setting the record in the heats with a time of 24"52, she further improved her record in the final, stopping the clock at 24"43, a result that allowed her to win the gold medal and consolidate her position as a leader on the national scene.
