What is the Partnership Medal of Merit?

This decoration represents an exclusive honor in the Hungarian military landscape:

- **Who awards it:** It is directly awarded by the Chief of Defense Staff of Hungary.
- **Who it is intended for:** Foreign military personnel who have distinguished themselves for exceptional activities in the performance of joint tasks.

- **An exclusive award:** By law, the honor can be granted to a maximum of **50 people per year** worldwide.

This recognition of Colonel Bruschi only confirms the excellence of Italian leadership in international operational theaters and the value of synergy among NATO allied countries.
