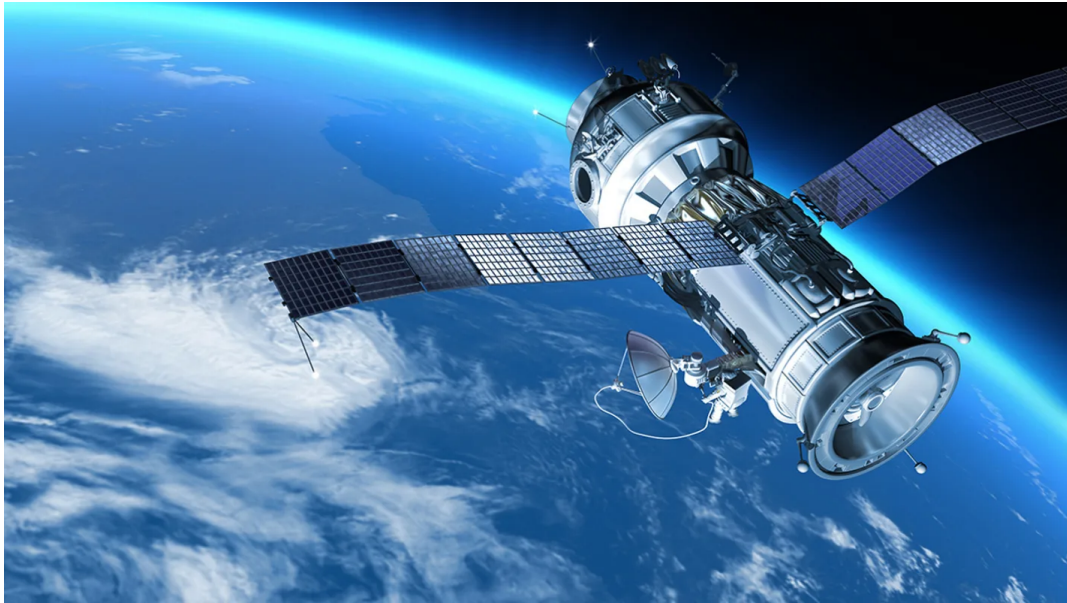




The New Frontier of Security: The Militarization of Space and the US Space Force

In this scenario, the Space Force is not limited to defending access to space but also works to prevent and counter potential threats from global rivals.

The protection of satellites and other space assets is essential to ensure the continuity of military and civilian operations. Additionally, the Space Force is investing in secure navigation technologies, interference-resistant communications, and missile warning systems, to ensure that the United States and its allies can operate unhindered in space.

International Alliances and Space Cooperation

In an increasingly contested space environment, international alliances and cooperation between countries have become a fundamental element for space security and stability. The Space Force cannot operate alone; its strategy is based on a strong partnership with global allies and partners. As highlighted by Saltzman, significant progress has been made in recent

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To build trust among allies, the Space Force has also implemented reforms in security classifications, allowing for the timely and secure sharing of sensitive information. This type of integration is crucial for creating a unified space coalition and staying one step ahead of emerging threats. Another key element of this cooperation is the appointment of British Air Marshal Paul Godfrey as Assistant Chief of Space Operations, a move that underscores the importance of strong alliances and shared management of space operations.

Looking to the future, the main goal of the Space Force for 2030 is to ensure that space remains a safe, stable, and sustainable domain, benefiting not only the United States but also the international community. With the increasing congestion and contestation in space, protecting this domain becomes a shared priority for all countries that depend on space technologies for their security and prosperity.

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
