The San Marco Marine Brigade originates from an ancient tradition of Marine infantry, dating back to 1878 with the first landing units and consolidating in 1919 with the Marine Infantry Regiment. The modern Brigade, officially activated in 2013, today represents the main amphibious asset of the Italian Navy, ready to intervene quickly in crisis contexts or multinational operations.

The mission of the BMSM is maritime protection, force projection from sea to land, and support for national and international security. Technological innovation and continuous training are the beating heart of the Brigade, which constantly compares itself with the best amphibious units in the world, such as the US Marines and the British Royal Marines. The integration of command and control systems (C2), rapid intervention, and the ability to adapt to modern operational scenarios make the Brigade an indispensable tool for national defense.

The 1st and 2nd San Marco Regiment: Different Missions, Same Spirit

Within the Brigade, the 1st and 2nd San Marco Regiment embody two complementary aspects of amphibious operations.

The 1st San Marco Regiment is the landing maneuver element of the Landing Force. Its Marine riflemen are trained for Rapid Onset Military Operations (ROMO) in complex maritime and terrestrial environments. Specialized in creating beachheads, supporting land forces, and initially controlling critical areas, these soldiers must face the unpredictable, both during assault landings and in evacuation and rescue contexts. Being part of the 1st Regiment means mastering sea, coast, and land with the same ease.

The 2nd San Marco Regiment, on the other hand, is the force specialized in naval security. Its operators are responsible for Force Protection aboard Italian military ships, with tasks ranging from controlling transits in risk areas to boarding suspicious vessels (VBSS). With rigorous training in Maritime Interdiction Operations (MIO), they are protagonists in boarding, inspection, and threat neutralization operations. Their work is essential to ensure the safety of convoys and naval units in missions like "Aspides", "Atalanta", and "Mediterraneo Sicuro".

Both Regiments, despite having different tasks, share common values: sacrifice, adaptability, resilience, and an inexhaustible dedication to duty.
