



US Generals Seek New Ideas for Iran

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After months of conflict and prolonged tensions, the US military apparatus finds itself facing an operational stalemate and is reportedly seeking "**new ideas**" to revive its offensive. This is revealed by **CNN**, which has seen an internal communication from the top of the American armed forces.

The internal request: "We are looking for creative and unconventional ways"

According to the US broadcaster and confirmed by sources close to the dossier, a senior officer from the intelligence branch of the **United States Central Command (Centcom)** sent an explicit message to a wide group of military analysts:

"We need ideas. We are looking for new creative and unconventional ways to pressure and punish Iran."

The request, forwarded over the past week, reflects the growing strategic difficulties on the ground. Diplomatic attempts to reach a peace agreement have so far failed, while the ongoing threats of bombings against Tehran do not seem to have had the hoped-for deterrent effect.

- **The stalemate factor:** The conflict is bogged down in a complex situation, where traditional options risk not producing further concrete results.
- **The search for alternatives:** "Sometimes creative minds are needed, especially when conventional options are running out,"* emphasized one of the sources interviewed by CNN.

Nuclear sites targeted: the administration considers escalation

Alongside the search for new strategies, the administration led by **Donald Trump** is considering the possibility of further intensifying the military campaign. At the center of the evaluations would be the resumption of targeted attacks against the remaining Iranian nuclear installations.

Sources informed about military planning confirm that the army is actively preparing to strike:

- **Mount Pickaxe** and other strategic sites deemed crucial for the preservation of nuclear material or equipment.
- New raids to complete the work, after previous attacks last summer were described by Trump himself as an action that had "annihilated" Tehran's atomic capabilities.

The combination of Centcom intelligence's search for unconventional solutions and the political pressure for an escalation outlines an increasingly tense geopolitical scenario, with diplomatic maneuvering margins reduced to a minimum.
